



Preventable diseases

Dogs

Parvovirus, Distemper, Hepatitis, Canine Cough (Bordetella and Parainfluenza), Coronavirus and Leptospirosis.

Cats

Feline Enteritis, Feline Flu, Leukaemia, FIV and Chlamydia.

It is advisable to consult your veterinary surgeon regarding the most suitable vaccination programme for your pet. This card should be kept in a safe place for presentation to boarding kennels and to your veterinary surgeon for booster vaccinations.

Keeping your pet healthy

Worming

Puppies and kittens need to be treated for roundworm, hookworm, tapeworm and whipworm every 2 weeks until 3 months old (at 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 & 12 weeks of age) then repeated monthly until 6 months old (at 4, 5 & 6 months of age). After 6 months of age worming or faecal tests are required every 3 months for the rest of your pet's life.

Heartworm

Heartworm is best prevented by an annual injection given to puppies at 3 months, then 9 months of age, and annually thereafter. Monthly tablets or topical applications are also available.

Fleas

Fleas can cause extreme discomfort for your pet and may also result in a skin condition called flea allergy dermatitis. Fleas can also carry and transmit tapeworm, and in large numbers they may cause anaemia. To prevent fleas we recommend regular applications of flea prevention (usually monthly) as well as treating and eliminating fleas in your pet's environment.

Ticks

The paralysis tick, *Ixodes holocyclus* is a parasite that may attach to your pet and feed on his/her blood. Tick paralysis is fatal if left untreated. The best protection for your pet is daily searching in conjunction with preventions that may include tablets, collars and/or topical applications. If a tick is found remove it immediately (keep the tick for identification purposes) and contact us for further advice.

Please note

All veterinary vaccines, prior to use, are subject to stringent tests to ensure both safety and efficiency. However, it should be noted that, very occasionally, an animal may either fail to respond to vaccination or develop a local or generalised reaction following vaccination.
